## **PROF. SHIZUKO TOMODA**

Prof. Shizuko Tomoda is a professor emerita of Central Connecticut State University. She earned a Ph.D. in linguistics at University of Arizona 1990. While working on her dissertation, she taught at University of California at Santa Barbara and University of Oregon. She joined the faculty at Central Connecticut State University in 1989, where she taught the Japanese language and culture for 32 years. Also, over 20 years, as a faculty member of the Honors Program and the Peace Studies Program, she taught several courses on Hiroshima memories and the legacy of Hiroshima in the nuclear age.
